Num Pang: With less than two years under its belt this tight bi-level Cambodian sandwich spot has already become something of a staple in the neighborhood. For what you get, the menu is a not-too-expensive, with sandwiches ranging from \$6.75-\$8.75 (the \$7.50 five-spiced pork belly is great). But then you'll also want to get corn on the cob with chili mayo, coconut flakes, chili powder (\$2.25) and a beverage and suddenly your lunch isn't quite as cheap. But you really won't regret it. There is a bit of seating upstairs, but it can be tight.
